## DRACAENA CARE GUIDE

Dracaenas are the perfect mix of drama and low-maintenance care. With their long, sword-like leaves and bold architectural shape, they add a striking look to any space. Plus, they're incredibly adaptable—some varieties can survive low light, while others thrive in brighter spots. Many Dracaenas are also drought-tolerant, making them great for forgetful waterers.

## LIGHT REQUIREMENTS



- ✓ Best: Bright, indirect light for fast growth and vibrant colors.
- ✓ Tolerates: Low light, but growth will be much slower.
- ✓ Avoid: Direct sunlight—it can scorch the leaves.

Pro Tip: If you have a variegated Dracaena (like 'Song of India'), it needs more light to maintain its bright colors. Green-leaved types tolerate lower light better.

#### SOIL & POTTING NEEDS

- ✓ Use a well-draining, loose potting mix—a standard houseplant mix with added perlite or sand works
- ✓ Avoid heavy, moisture-retaining soils—Dracaenas prefer drier conditions.
- ✓ Repot every 2–3 years to refresh the soil and prevent root crowding.

Bonus Tip: Dracaenas don't like sitting in wet soil, so always choose a pot with drainage holes.

## **GROWTH & SIZE**

- ✓ Growth Rate: Moderate—faster in brighter light, slower in low light.
- ✓ Can grow 3–10 feet tall indoors, depending on
- ✓ Some varieties, like Dracaena marginata, can be pruned to encourage branching.

Want a taller, tree-like look? Let your Dracaena grow long, woody stems, or trim it back to encourage bushy growth.

### **HUMIDITY & TEMPERATURE**

- ✓ Humidity: Prefers 40–50% humidity, but adapts to normal home conditions.
- ✓ Temperature: Thrives in 65–80°F (18–27°C).
- ✓ Avoid cold drafts, AC vents, and heaters, which can dry out the leaves.

Humidity Hack: If the leaf edges start browning, it's a sign your plant wants more humidity—try misting or placing it near a humidifier.

### WATERING SCHEDULE









- ✓ Water every 2–3 weeks, allowing the top half of the soil to dry out before watering again.
- ✓ In low light, water even less—every 3–4 weeks.
- ✓ Dracaenas hate tap water chemicals—use filtered, distilled, or rainwater to avoid brown leaf tips.

Common Mistake: Overwatering is the #1 killer—if leaves turn yellow and drop, check for soggy soil!

## COMMON ISSUES & TROUBLESHOOTING

► Brown Leaf Tips?

✓ Likely caused by tap water chemicals, dry air, or underwatering—switch to filtered water and increase humidity.

- Yellowing or Drooping Leaves? ✓ Usually a sign of overwateringlet soil dry out more between waterings.
- Soft, Mushy Stem? ✓ Root rot from too much water—check for soggy soil and trim any damaged roots.
- Leaves Curling or Wrinkling? ✓ Not enough water! Give it a drink and adjust your schedule.

#### **Bonus Tip:**

Dracaena dustfree by wiping the leaves with a damp cloth every couple of weeks—clean leaves absorb more light and stay healthier!
